WORLD BANK UPS INDIA'S FY26 GROWTH FORECAST TO 6.5%, CITES POSITIVE IMPACT OF GST REFORMS




The World Bank has raised India's growth forecast to 6.5% for the financial year 2026 from its earlier projection of 6.3% in June, citing resilient domestic demand, strong rural recovery and the positive impact of Goods and Services Tax (GST) reforms. In its latest South Asia Development Update, the World Bank said that India is expected to remain the world's fastest-growing major economy, underpinned by strong consumption growth.

NITI AAYOG URGES MANUFACTURING PUSH AS TRADE HITS \$1.73 TRILLION IN FY25

India's apex public policy think tank NITI Aayog stressed on the need to strengthen and diversify the country's manufacturing base. In a report, it highlighted that the country's total trade in financial year 2025 stood at US\$ 1.73 trillion, growing 6% year-on-year with exports US\$ 823 billion and imports at US\$ 908 billion. It also highlighted that services exports reached a record US\$ 387.5 billion in the financial year 2025.

EXPORT SURGE: INDIA STEPS UP ON GLOBAL STAGE




As per the recently released data, in August 2025, Indian exports registered a positive growth of 4.77% vs. August 2024. Exports increased by 5.19% to US\$ 346.10 billion in April-August 2025 in comparison to April-August 2024. Merchandise export rose by 2.31% and service export up surged by 8.65% in April-August 2025. India's exports to Hong Kong, China, USA, Germany, Korea, UAE, Nepal, Belgium, Bangladesh, and Brazil have climbed the ladder of growth in April-August 2025 vs. April-August 2024.

INDIA'S TRADE TIES STRENGTHENED AS INDIA-EFTA TRADE AND ECONOMIC PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT COMES INTO EFFECT


The India-European Free Trade Association (EFTA) Trade and Economic Partnership Agreement which came into effect from 01 October 2025, is a defining moment in country's external trade policy. Under the pact, EFTA is offering tariff concessions on over 92% of tariff lines, covering more than 99% of India's exports, including non-agricultural goods and processed agricultural products. India has extended access on 82.7% of tariff lines, accounting for more than 95% of EFTA exports.

INDIA AIMS FOR US\$ 100 BILLION IN TEXTILE EXPORTS BY 2030



India's Ministry of Textiles celebrated World Cotton Day 2025 on 07 October with a strong push for sustainability, technology adoption, and export growth in the cotton sector. Union Minister of Textiles Giriraj Singh reaffirmed the government's commitment to achieving US\$ 100 billion in textile exports as part of a broader US\$ 350 billion textile sector target by 2030. He stressed that India, which holds 40% of the world's cotton cultivation area has a significant growth potential since the current productivity at around 450 kg per hectare, compared to global levels of 2,000 kg per hectare.


Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated Phase One of the Navi Mumbai International Airport, marking a major milestone in India's aviation infrastructure. The airport, built at a cost of about US\$ 2.37 billion, is expected to begin commercial operations by December 2025. With this, Mumbai joins the league of global cities such as London, New York, and Tokyo that have more than one international airport. The Prime Minister noted that in 2014, India had only 74 airports, while today the number has increased to more than 160.

THREE MAJOR PORTS RECOGNISED AS GREEN HYDROGEN HUBS UNDER NATIONAL GREEN HYDROGEN MISSION

India's Ministry of New and Renewable Energy has formally recognised three major Indian ports as Green Hydrogen Hubs under the National Green Hydrogen Mission. These ports are Deendayal Port Authority in Gujarat, V.O. Chidambaranar Port Authority in Tamil Nadu and Paradip Port Authority in Odisha. The recognition marks a significant step towards creating an integrated hydrogen ecosystem and advancing India's transition towards clean energy.




The National Green Hydrogen Mission aims to position India as a global hub for the production, utilisation, and export of green hydrogen and its derivatives. It promotes the development of large-scale hydrogen hubs to serve as focal points for production and consumption.

NASA-ISRO SATELLITE SENDS FIRST RADAR IMAGES OF EARTH'S SURFACE



The NISAR (NASA-ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar) Earth-observing radar satellite's first images of our planet's surface have been released, and they offer a glimpse of things to come as the joint mission between NASA and ISRO (Indian Space Research Organisation) approaches full science operations later this year. In late August, NISAR's radar systems turned on for a series of test runs. The satellite, launched by India's space agency on July 30, 2025, is now orbiting Earth at an altitude of 464 miles.
