### INDIA ELECTED UNOPPOSED TO UN HUMAN RIGHTS COUNCIL FOR 2026-2028 TERM

India has been elected unopposed to the Human Rights Council for the seventh time for a three-year term (2026-2028) starting next year. India's Permanent Representative at the UN P Harish said that the election UNITED NATIONS reflects India's unwavering commitment to human rights and HUMAN RIGHTS COUNCIL fundamental freedoms and that India looks forward to serving this objective during his tenure. He also thanked all the delegations for their overwhelming support.

The Human Rights Council is the main UN body with 47 members. It promotes and protects human rights around the world, reviews the situation in member countries, and provides a forum to discuss issues. The Council was formed by the General Assembly in 2006, when India was elected to its first term.

### GOOGLE AI HUB IN VISAKHAPATNAM

Google, in a landmark development, announced it's plans for the first-ever Google AI hub in Visakhapatnam, Indida. This hub combines gigawatt-scale compute capacity, a new international subsea gateway, and large-scale energy infrastructure. Through it we will bring our industry-leading technology to enterprises and users in India, accelerating AI innovation and driving growth across the country. In an official statement, Google said "our largest investment in India to date, totaling approximately US \$15 billion over the next five years (2026-2030), this capital will establish our first Artificial Intelligence (AI) hub in the country."

### INDIA'S GDP TO GROW FASTER THAN EXPECTED DESPITE US TARIFFS: IMF

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has said, India's GDP will grow faster than estimated earlier despite the impact of US tariffs on Indian economy. In its World Economic Outlook report, the IMF showed India's GDP growth rate for 2025-26 at 6.6% versus 6.4% earlier. But the IMF has lowered its estimates by 20 basis points to 6.2% for 2026-27. The upward revision was on carryover from a strong first quarter more than offsetting the increase in the US effective tariff rate on imports from India since July. The IMF has edged up its 2025 global growth forecast as tariff shocks and financial conditions have proven more benign than expected.

# NITI AAYOG RELEASES REPORT ON "INDIA'S BLUE ECONOMY: STRATEGY FOR HARNESSING DEEP-SEA AND OFFSHORE FISHERIES"



India's NITI Aayog launched a report titled "India's Blue Economy: Strategy for Harnessing Deep Sea and Offshore Fisheries." India has around 12 nautical miles of sovereign water zone and 200 miles as an economic zone, and has barely explored its deep-sea resources. A three-phase roadmap has been proposed to strengthen country's governance of deep-sea and offshore fisheries. The first phase begins with laying the foundation, followed by scaling up operations, and ultimately achieving global leadership in sustainable deep-sea fisheries.

The report offers a comprehensive framework to strengthen governance, foster innovation, and enhance stakeholder participation, ensuring prosperity for coastal communities and contributing significantly to the nation's Blue Economy vision.


India has emphasised that G20 must act as a bridge between ambition and implementation, ensuring that every nation's contribution is respected and every nation's capacity is enhanced. During the G20 Climate and Environmental Sustainability Working Group Ministerial Meeting in South Africa, it was stated that the country truly believes and supports ecosystem-based approaches, participatory implementation and landscape-level conservation models as proposed in the biodiversity and conservation track. India emphasized the need to exercise caution in commodifying biodiversity and call for a deeper examination of the same and that India supports integrating climate and development while upholding equity and Common but Differentiated Responsibilities.

# CHANDRAYAAN-2 MAKES FIRST EVER OBSERVATION OF SUN'S CORONAL MASS EJECTIONS' EFFECTS ON THE MOON



In a landmark scientific breakthrough, the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) announced that its lunar orbiter Chandrayaan-2 has made the first-ever observation of the effects of the Coronal Mass Ejections (CMEs) from the Sun on the Moon using its onboard scientific instrument. This observation would help understand the lunar exosphere, the thin atmosphere of the Moon, and the impact of space weather on its surface.

Launched on 22nd of July in 2019, from Sriharikota using the GSLV-MkIII-M1 rocket, Chandrayaan-2 carried eight experiment payloads. On August 20, 2019, Chandrayaan-2 was successfully inserted into the elliptical orbit around the Moon.

The ISRO in a statement said, one of the payloads (on-board Chandrayan-2), Chandra's Atmospheric Compositional Explorer 2 (CHACE 2) has recorded the effects of the Coronal Mass ejections from the Sun on the lunar exosphere. The primary objective of the CHACE-2 payload is to study the composition and distribution of the lunar neutral exosphere and its variability. ISRO scientists reported that the number density of neutral atoms and molecules in the exosphere increased by more than an order of magnitude, confirming theoretical predictions that had never before been validated through direct observation.

ISRO said the findings not only deepen scientific understanding of lunar space weather but also have implications for future lunar missions and the design of human habitats on the Moon.

A team of Turkish tour operators visited the Consulate. They expressed interest in expanding outbound to India and showcasing more destinations to Turkish tourists.




Consul General met Bernard Arkas, VP of Arkas Holding to discuss business in India. Arkas Holding, a major logistics and shipping company, is an investor in India.
