India co-chairs UN Group advocating accountability for crimes against peacekeepers

India has strongly reiterated its commitment to ensuring justice for crimes committed against UN peacekeepers, calling accountability a strategic necessity for the success of global peacekeeping missions. At a high-level UN meeting of the Group of Friends (GoF) for promoting accountability, it was conveyed that peacekeepers face serious threats while serving in dangerous areas, yet most crimes against them go unpunished.

The GoF for Accountability of Crimes against Peacekeepers was formally launched in December 2022 during India's Presidency of the UN Security Council, building upon the landmark Security Council Resolution 2589 (2021), a resolution that was piloted by India and specifically called for facilitating accountability for crimes committed against peacekeepers. India, the largest contributor of troops to UN missions, has sent over 300,000 peacekeepers in the past 70 years, with 182 losing their lives. India continues to lead efforts to protect peacekeepers and ensure justice.

AAIB appeals media to refrain from spreading premature narratives regarding AI plane crash

India's Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau (AAIB) has issued an appeal to the public and the media "to refrain from spreading premature narratives" about the Air India crash of June 12 and also noted that certain sections of the international media are repeatedly attempting to draw conclusions through selective and unverified reporting, and urged both the public and the media to refrain from spreading premature narratives that risk undermining the integrity of the investigative process. AAIB appealed to all concerned to await publication of Final Investigation Report after completion of the Investigation.

Designation of The Resistance Front (TRF) by the United States Department of State

India welcomed the decision of the United States Department of State to designate The Resistance Front (TRF) as a Foreign Terrorist Organization (FTO) and as a Specially Designated Global Terrorist (SDGT). The TRF has been involved in numerous terror-related activities, including the heinous attack on

civilians in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir, on 22 April 2025 for which it twice claimed responsibility. The designation of TRF is a timely and important step reflecting the deep cooperation between India and the United States on counter-terrorism.

India's Renewable Rise: Non-Fossil Sources Now Power Half the Nation's Grid

India has achieved a landmark in its energy transition journey by reaching 50% of its installed electricity capacity from non-fossil fuel sources—five years ahead of the target set under its Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) to the Paris Agreement. This significant milestone underscores the country's steadfast commitment to climate action and sustainable development, and signals that India's clean energy transition is not only real but also accelerating.

India's EV sales projected to cross 7% market share by FY28: CareEdge report

India's electric car sales are projected to cross a 7% market share by FY28, provided supply chain challenges around rare earth elements (REEs) are addressed in time, according to a new report released by CareEdge. The report highlighted that India's electric car market has witnessed robust growth over the past three years, expanding from just over 5,000 units in FY21 to more than 107 thousand units in FY25, a 21-fold increase. While electric four-wheelers currently form a small part of India's overall EV sales, the segment is expected to see rapid expansion in the coming years, driven by fresh model launches, strengthening public policy support and growing private sector participation. The first Tesla showroom in India recently opened in Mumbai, laying the groundwork for further expansion.

India's High-Performance Computing (HPC) systems for Weather and Climate Prediction

India's Ministry of Earth Sciences has commissioned India's High-Performance Computing (HPC) systems Arka and Arunika for use in weather and climate prediction. With a combined computing power of 22 Peta FLOPS, these state-of-the-art supercomputers will enable ultra-high-resolution forecasts up to 1 km, harness AI & ML for better prediction of extreme weather and strengthen disaster preparedness and resilience against climate variability. This marks a transformative step in delivering more accurate, reliable, and timely weather and climate services for India's farmers, fishermen, planners, and citizens.
